National Museum of Nuclear Science & History

All student attendees are invited to an exclusive and **free** trip to the [National Museum of Nuclear Science and History](https://www.nmsh.gov/)! The museum was established in 1969 as an intriguing place to learn the story of the Atomic Age, from early research of nuclear development (e.g., the Manhattan Project) through today's peaceful uses of nuclear technology. Visitors can explore how nuclear science continues to influence our world. The museum strives to present, through permanent and changing exhibits and displays, the diverse applications of nuclear science in the past, present, and future along with the stories of the field's pioneers.

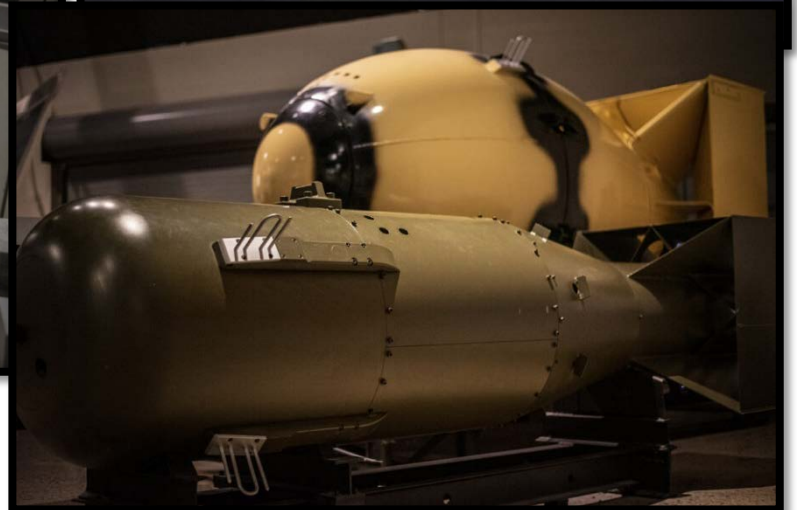
After the museum, we will stop for lunch before returning to the hotel.

Botanic & Japanese Gardens / Old Town

Tuesday, May 20th

A wonderful day trip awaits those who choose to join us for an expedition to the [Albuquerque Botanic and Japanese Gardens](#). These beautiful attractions will surely appeal to all nature lovers. Opened in 1996, the Botanic Garden has grown to 32 acres of exhibits and showcases plants from the American Southwest and around the world. The Botanic Garden's BUGarium is one of the most elaborate exhibits dedicated to bugs and arthropods in the country. Also, the four-acre Sasebo Japanese Garden hosts a majestic waterfall, an elegant koi pond and a mixture of Japanese and local plants. Stone lanterns and pagoda sculptures dot the grounds and stone and wooden bridges straddle small streams. The Travel Channel cites ABQ BioPark Botanic Garden as one of the top 12 in the country!

Following our trip to the gardens, we will travel to Old Town for lunch and a chance to shop and explore this historic part of the city.

Sawmill Market

Wednesday, May 21st

Go on a culinary adventure to the [Sawmill Market](#) just minutes away from the Clyde Hotel. The Sawmill Market was created in 2019 by transforming the historic Paxton lumberyard building into a 34,000-square-foot food hall, outdoor gathering place, and community gathering hall for Albuquerque, showcasing the beauty of New Mexico through food, diversity, and art. The market houses 27 individual local merchants including a brewpub, a cocktail and wine bar, and a mercantile shop. At the center is THE YARD, an outdoor dining and play space. An hourly shuttle will be available.

Shuttle departs hourly from the hotel lobby beginning at 3:00 PM. The last shuttle will leave the market by 9:00 PM.



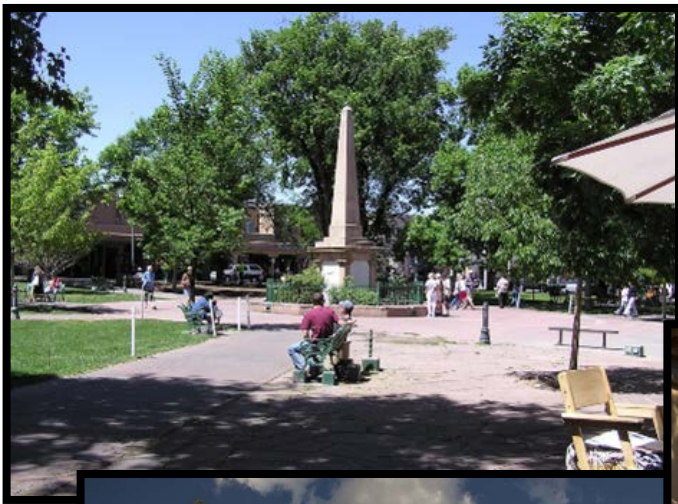
Santa Fe

Thursday, May 22nd

Another incredible day trip you don't want to miss will be our adventure to nearby historic [Santa Fe, New Mexico](#). Founded in 1610 as the capital of Nuevo México, a province of New Spain, Santa Fe is the oldest state capital in the United States and the earliest European settlement west of the Mississippi River. Santa Fe, which hosts over 250 art galleries and a large concentration of museums, is widely regarded as one of the country's great art cities due to its vibrant art scene.

The day will begin with a drive to the Santa Fe Plaza, which is at the cultural heart of the city. A short walk from the plaza will take you to the Palace of Governors, New Mexico Museum of Art, the New Mexico History Museum, and the Cathedral Basilica of Saint Francis of Assisi.

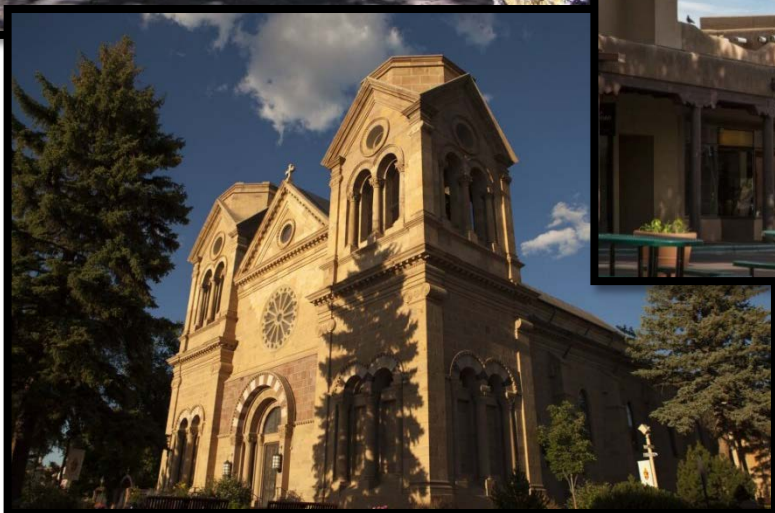
Once your morning sightseeing is done, we will have lunch at one of the many local restaurants, then return to the Clyde hotel in the afternoon.

Thursday, May 23rd

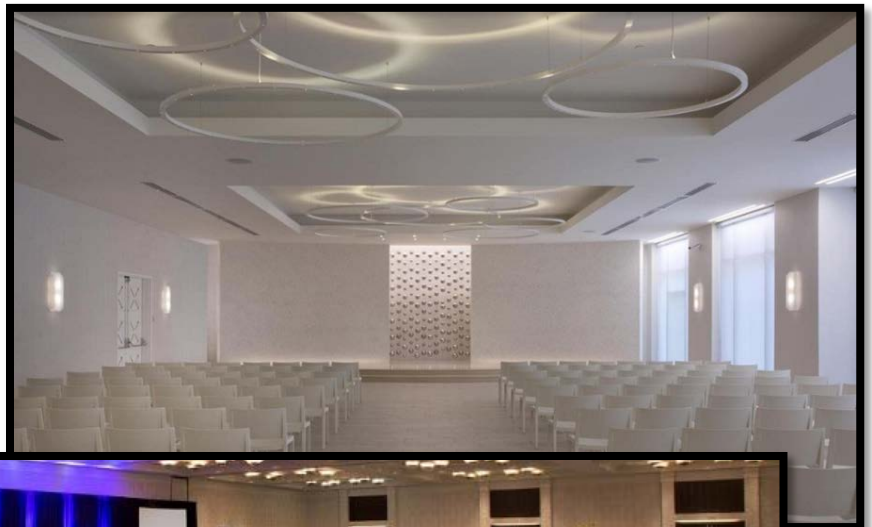
